New Israeli Technology Can Predict Resistance to Chemotherapy

NewStem, a biotech startup based in Jerusalem, is developing a novel diagnostic kit for predicting resistance to chemotherapy treatments. The problem to be addressed is that chemotherapy, still the mainstay in cancer treatment, often results in the tumor developing resistance to the drugs, rendering the therapy ineffective. It also unnecessarily subjects patients to powerful pharmaceuticals that are no longer effective. The technology is based on the pioneering research of Prof. Nissim Benvenisty of the Azrieli Center for Stem Cells and Genetic Research at the Hebrew University of Jerusalem.
