****ALAN COOPERMAN COMES TO HAR ZION TEMPLE – WEDNESDAY, JULY 13, 7:30 PM *What Divides Us? What Unites Us? Israel and American Jews***

Alan Cooperman is Director of Religion Research at the Pew Research Center. He is an expert on religion's role in U.S. politics and has reported on religion in Russia, the Middle East and Europe. He plays a central role in planning the project's research agenda and writing its reports. Before

joining the Pew Research Center, he was a national reporter and editor at the Washington Post, foreign editor of U.S. News & World Report, and a foreign correspondent for the Associated Press. He graduated magna cum laude from Harvard in 1982 and started in journalism at the Berkshire Eagle in Pittsfield, Mass. He is an author of *Mormons in America*, *Muslim Americans*, the *U.S. Religious Knowledge Survey*, "Nones" on the Rise and *A Portrait of Jewish Americans*. He also was the primary editor of the 2014 U.S. Religious Landscape Study and The Future of World Religions. He has appeared on numerous media outlets, including NPR, BBC, Radio Free Europe/Radio Liberty, the NewsHour, NBC, ABC, CBS, CNN, Fox, MSNBC and C-SPAN.

INNOVATION UPDATE FROM  ISRAEL IDEAS

Seven Israeli Robots That Are Transforming Surgery

Robotic or robot-assisted surgery can give doctors better vision, precision, flexibility and control when performing complex minimally invasive procedures. Someday, surgeons will even use robotic tools to operate through the Internet, bringing modern medical techniques to remote parts of the world. Only a handful of surgical robots are currently approved for use, and Israelis developed three of them.

"This really puts us in the center of the field," says Prof. Wolf, founding director of the Biorobotics and Biomechanics Lab at Technion-Israel Institute of Technology. Wolf was studying for his doctorate under robotics pioneer Moshe Shoham when they started developing SpineAssist for minimally invasive spinal surgery.
