INNOVATION UPDATE FROM 15/22 Israeli Breakthrough May Lead To Melanoma Cure

Melanoma, the most aggressive and lethal type of skin cancer, kills one person every 52 minutes according to data from the Skin Cancer Foundation. Moreover, the number of diagnosed cases has been on the rise for the past three decades. There is still no full cure for this life-threatening disease, despite a range of therapies developed over the years. The new study proposes novel and effective methods for diagnosis and prevention. Israeli and European researchers say their collaborative research has unraveled the metastatic mechanism of melanoma, the most aggressive of all skin cancers. According to a paper published in the journal Nature Cell Biology, the scientists discovered that before spreading to other organs, a melanoma tumor sends out tiny vesicles containing molecules of microRNA. These cause morphological (structural) changes in the skin's dermis layer in preparation for receiving and transporting the cancer cells.
