INNOVATION UPDATE FROM ISRAELIDEAS

Joining Forces With Israel-founded Via To Bring Ride-sharing To Europe

Via has developed an on-demand ride-sharing service: its mobile app connects multiple
passengers who are headed the same way, allowing riders to share a vehicle. In the joint venture
with Mercedes-Benz Vans, passengers headed in the same direction will be matched with a single
van, increasing vehicle utilization while relieving the strain on inner-city roads.

London will be the first city to launch the new joint service this year. Other European metropolises
will soon follow, Mercedes' parent company Daimler AG said in a statement. Via, which has been
working with Daimler since 2015, plans to raise a total of \$200 million for the joint expansion as
