INNOVATION UPDATE FROM

Helping Kids to Beat Cyber-Cullies

The Israeli app Red Button gives users a way to fight back

Cyber-bullying is the harassment of web users by individuals or groups. There have been numerous incidents in which kids have been targeted, with tragic results. It is especially perilous for children whose inexperience renders them vulnerable to hackers, bullies and pedophiles, or worse. An Israeli nonprofit called Red Button has produced the world's first app that lets anyone, especially kids, easily report negative web behavior. As an example, 45% of web users in Israel aged 10-17 say that they are victims of online abuse of some sort, yet only 20% of them report it to anyone. Red Button says these statistics are similar to those found elsewhere.
