### INNOVATION UPDATE FROM ISCAL DEAS How One Little Sensor Can Make Your Life Better

How did an Israeli startup evolve from using radio frequency (RF) technology intended to detect breast cancer to creating palm-sized devices that can monitor passengers in self-driving cars? That's the story of Vayyar Imaging, which is building a multi-purpose sensor with real-life uses that sound straight out of science fiction. Vayyar's three cofounders – Raviv Melamed, Miri Ratner and Naftali Chayat – discovered in 2011 that each had a family member suffering from cancer. They set out to make a difference. The product they built was a thumb-sized sensor with 24 built-in radio frequency (RF) antennas. RF signals can penetrate anything from human tissue to concrete walls. Because objects made of differing materials absorb the RF signals at varying rates, some signals go straight through an object while others bounce back at distinctive strengths, creating what Vayyar head of marketing Malcolm Berman describes as "a reflection."
