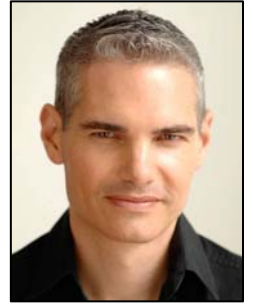

INNOVATION UPDATE FROM ISRAEL IDEAS
Colon Cancer Detection May be Transformed, Potentially Saving Millions of Lives.

Researchers from an Israeli start-up developed a revolutionary new technology that analyzes standard blood tests for the disease. **Maccabi Health Services**, together with researchers from the Israeli start-up **Medial Research**, unveiled a new technology that can predict the likelihood of colon cancer years before the disease is detected, using a formula to analyze the results of standard blood tests.

Colon cancer can go unnoticed for years and is often only discovered when abdominal pain starts. After it's discovered, the highly malignant disease can kill a patient in as little as several weeks.
