INNOVATION UPDATE FROM ISCALL DEAS Revolutionary Patch Keeps Brain Safe after Cranial Surgery

If you're ever unfortunate enough to require brain surgery, Israeli startup Nurami Medical has got you covered – literally. The Haifa-based company has developed a patch made of synthetic, biodegradable nanofibers meant to be affixed to the dura mater – the protective membrane underneath the skull that keeps the brain and spinal cord safe – after cranial neurosurgery. Brain surgery requires cutting through the dura, so a "bandage" of some sort must be placed to protect against bacteria, accelerate healing and keep cerebral spinal fluid from leaking. Nurami's nanofiber patches mimic the dura mater in a way that's safer and less expensive than the animal collagen-based products currently used for post-brain surgery recovery, said the company's CEO Hannoch Marksheid. Louis Magaziner and Julian Abele: The Story of a Special Friendship

Louis Magaziner, an immigrant from Humenne, Austria, became the first Jewish graduate of the University of Pennsylvania's School of Architecture and went on to design many prominent buildings in the Philadelphia area and beyond. Julian Francis Abele, the program's first African American graduate, designed Duke University's campus and worked on numerous local landmarks including the Philadelphia Museum of Art and the Central Branch of the Free Library. In this illustrated talk, Magaziner's great grandniece explores the strong bond and lifelong friendship that developed between these two notable men.
