Second Night Seder – Save the Date!

If you read the two descriptions of Passover in the Book of Exodus and the Book of Deuteronomy, you might be surprised to find that they are not identical. While Exodus depicts a Passover seder that is celebrated in individual homes by each family, Deuteronomy depicts a Passover experience that occurs at the Temple and is attended by every person in the community.

The Book of Deuteronomy prioritizes the centralization of worship at the Temple and insists that the community must celebrate Passover together. To honor this vision of Passover, Har Zion will host the Second Night Seder and bring members and friends together to enjoy the rich and beautiful customs that we have come to know and love.

The second night of Passover will be Thursday, April 9, and we will celebrate the seder at Har Zion from 5:30-8 PM. While 5:30 PM is before

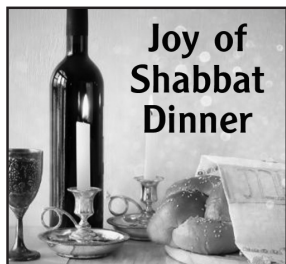

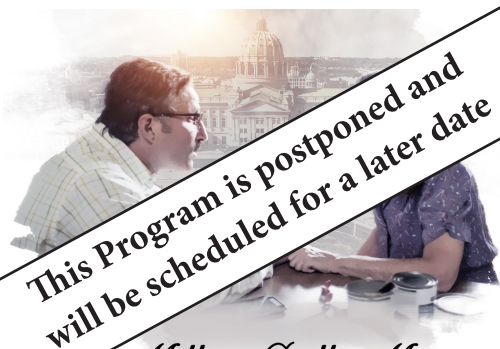

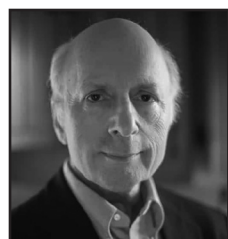
My Journey and The World of Interfaith Work Today

Allyson Zacharoff

Rabbinical student at the Reconstructionist Rabbinical College

Allyson has been working in multifaith dialogue for a number of years, studying different faiths and bringing people together so we can all grow in understanding and respect.

Allyson will share her personal multifaith journey in greater detail, including how she came to study with priests in Rome, the multifaith work she did in Jerusalem, and what it was like studying the Qur'an in Connecticut with people of various faiths. She will share some of her methodology for this work and various projects she has worked on, give more details on some of the work being done in the U.S. and around the world at the local, national, and international levels, and share more of her personal perspective as a young woman in this field.

***A Physician's Personal Account
of the Yom Kippur War***

Dr. Itzhak Brook

Author of the book *In the Sands of Sinai, a Physician's Account of the Yom Kippur War*

This presentation includes a description of the historical background of the Yom Kippur War and its effects on the Israeli society, as well as Dr. Brook's own personal experiences and challenges as a battalion physician in the Sinai. You will hear about the physical and psychological traumas his soldiers had to cope with, the effect of religion on them, the cost of war in human life and suffering, and the daily struggle for survival in the difficult war which threatened Israel's existence.

What is Multifaith Engagement at Har Zion?

Message from **Allyson Zacharoff**

You may have heard about it over the past few months, but what *exactly* do we mean when we say we're building up multifaith programming at Har Zion?

We mean that we want to make sure that everyone in the Har Zion community has the opportunity to meet people of different faiths and have discussions around important multifaith issues. Perhaps you will hear a local pastor give a guest lecture at the shul about how her congregation is undertaking their own version of *tikkun olam*, repairing the world, in our neighborhood, and then go out and work with her congregation on that project. Maybe you will attend a lunchtime lecture at a local mosque to learn more about the history of that faith from someone who lives it out every day, sharing more about how your kosher practices match (or don't!) their own halal rules around food. It's possible you may come to a small group meeting at the synagogue about how your multifaith family can navigate tricky conversations

around faith (following up on our successful December 5 session about how different interfaith families choose to celebrate the winter holiday season).

So what do we mean by "multifaith work" at Har Zion? We mean that we are making sure

that we are living out our Jewish values of forming stronger, deeper relationships with the people around us because we believe that as Jews are called upon to love the stranger. We are working to promote *shalom bayit*, or peace in the home, as we have important conversations with our family members of different faiths because we need to demonstrate deep respect for the different traditions of those we care about. As Jews and as people, we are called upon to do what we can in our lifetimes to make this world a better place, and here at Har Zion, one way we choose to do that is by forging stronger relationships with those around us – people of all faiths, in our neighborhoods and in our families.

We welcome you to join us.

"Try it – You Might Like It"

Message from **Debbie Folz**,
Director of Early Childhood Education



Over winter break I was lucky enough to get away and go on a cruise. One morning at breakfast a passenger next to us was given the wrong kind of bagel. Instead of politely pointing out the mistake she berated the server in a way that was shocking to all that were in close proximity. The passenger was so upset that her face was turning red and you could see by her body language and her tone that she was extremely distraught. A conversation at my table then followed about what made her think it was okay to talk to another person like that and what leads a person to be so upset over something so minor? How do our teachers instill in the children that are in their care that the way we communicate to one another reflects what kind of person we are and how we are perceived by others? As Jews one of our values to teach is *Chesed*, which is an easy trait to teach.

One of the most important goals of early childhood education is to teach children how to be respectful and kind to all people and creatures. We spend a big part of the day giving the tools to understand how another is feeling by using "their words" and reading body and facial clues. In a world with e-mail, twitter and text messages we have a very limited time to teach these skills before the majority of communication happens through our finger tips. How we react in certain situations and speak to another can greatly impact an outcome. Today as I walked into one of the Prachim classrooms, I overheard a little boy look at another and say "I love you" and then give him a hug. What a "Kodak" moment, but so telling of small children. As role models we need to constantly keep in mind that our little ones are watching and listening to how we respond to not only them, but the people around us.

We are all so busy working, while encountering various challenges within a day, but giving someone a smile or nice word can truly make a large impact. I am fortunate that I get to see the instinctual kindness and love that preschoolers show each other throughout their day. The challenge for all of us is to keep this natural instinct so when they become adults, it is still part of who they are as a person. For the lady at the breakfast table next to mine, I would have said to her what I say to our preschoolers, "try it – you might like it."

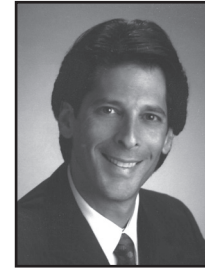
