# **Ritual Matters**

Message from Dr. Ely Levine,

Ritual Director and Scholar in Residence

One of the classes I teach here at Har Zion is called Jewish Books in Christian Bibles. In it, we explore texts that were written by Jews and for Jews, but which have been adopted primarily by Christians and have



been understood, interpreted, and shared with the world by Christians. We look at these texts that we "know" mean one thing and discover that they may have meant something very different two thousand years ago.

While everyone is welcome to join this class (and it has been received very positively by those who attend), I am not writing this in order to fish for more students. Instead, I am thinking about this because Purim is coming! What does Purim have to do with this? Purim is one of the few holidays whose inspiration is specifically about Jews interacting with non-Jews. In the story we reread every year in the Scroll of Esther, we tell about the struggle to fit into a non-Jewish world. For some good reasons, this is the holiday that most speaks to our contemporary Jewish condition. (Recently, we have even witnessed many more people than usual who would like to see us disappear!)

The connection with my class, however, comes from the issue of controlling the narrative. Who gets to tell our story? In the Scroll of Esther, it is Haman. He says to the king, "There is a certain people, scattered and dispersed among the other peoples in all the provinces of your realm, whose laws are different from those of any other people and who do not obey the king's laws; and it is not in Your Majesty's interest to tolerate them" (Esther 3:8). This is very different from how Esther or Mordecai would have told our story, had they been given the chance.

Similarly, when Christians read their Gospels, they see many critiques of Jews, bad-mouthing specifically the Pharisees. A word that identified one group within the Jewish community is redefined on the basis of the context in the Gospels to mean hypocrites, and then the word is expanded to refer to all Jews. By reading these texts as Jews, we can reclaim the terms, the ideas, and even the entire texts themselves, and help others to focus on how context *makes* meaning.

This is not to say that we could somehow eliminate antisemitism just by explaining ourselves better to others. I get the impression that a frank and open conversation would not have stopped Haman. No, but if we can tell our story, then we might better help to shape the general idea of Jews that exists in the cultural ether.

Before we can successfully share our story with others, however, we need to work on telling it among ourselves. Often, we have too simplified a version of the story that does not hold up to scrutiny. If that narrative is picked apart, we are left with nothing again. If we are prepared with a more sophisticated understanding – about Jewish identity, tradition and rituals, or Zionism – we can withstand and respond to critique. And we can come out stronger.

# JFGRS – Always Learning!

**Dr. Michael Schatz**, Assistant Director, JFGRS The winter season can be dull and dreary, but at the Jane Fishman Grinberg Religious School we keep the lights on!

Our children are all in the full swing of their learning by now, as our Bet and Gimel



students should be recognizing almost all of their Hebrew letters and decoding easy words, getting ready to be able to read prayers from a siddur. Our Gan and Aleph classes are learning Hebrew words through games and songs, getting ready to start reading in a year or so. And the older children are progressing through our prayer curriculum in order to be proficient daveners and participate in synagogue services. We celebrate our Gimel children's learning *Birkat HaMazon*, the Grace after Meals, with a family dinner on February 21. Each child is presented with a special *Birkon*, a song and blessing booklet that can be used at home. As our Aleph students will have made their Shabbat dinner-focused art projects and learned blessings, they too celebrate with a family model Shabbat "dinner" – complete with a special set table, brachot, and as befits a Sunday morning, a festive meal of yummy brunch food. This will be on February 12.

February also sees our Bet class trip to the Franklin Institute Fels Planetarium to see the special show Astral Almanac: A Festival of Light. This show highlights the way the moon and earth rotational cycles are recognized by Judaism and other religions, such as the way our holidays often fall on the New Moon or Full Moon.

Our Gimel class will be learning about the structure and design of a synagogue and will visit our magnificent Main Sanctuary for a full tour. Later they will have a trip to the northern suburbs to see how a different architect and congregation interpreted synagogue design with a visit to the world-famous Frank Lloyd Wright created Beth Sholom Synagogue in Elkins Park. Trip day for Bet and Gimel is February 12.

Outside Sunday and Tuesday school hours, our winter season sees the continuation of our Parents Night Out Saturday night programs, on January 21, February 4 and 25. Kids Shabbat, a Saturday morning kids' service and activity is on January 21 and February 11, and Family Friendly Fridays continue on February

The NCCECE is looking and moving towards the future in all facets of the school. From newly designed Thanksgiving celebrations to the additions of already strong safety protocols – our school is taking 'great' to the next level.



In November, I had the pleasure of attending the National Association for the Education of Young Children (NAEYC) Annual Conference in Washington DC. This conference brings early childhood educators and experts together from around the world to discuss new research, best practices, and how to tackle challenges ahead together. The conference was inspiring and reaffirming. The NCCECE is filled with dedicated staff that seek out best practices and collaboratively work together to continuously strengthen our programs. The conference reaffirmed our school philosophy that children learn best through play. While listening to experts and seeing real life examples of true play-based, student-led curriculum, I was excited to get back to Har Zion and share with the staff.

Most early childhood education centers today would tell you they are play-based and use student-driven curriculum. However, true play-based curriculum is not just kids playing in centers. Real play-based learning takes commitment to planning, depth of child development knowledge, and dedication to listening to students. Play-based learning means observing and listening to children play, knowing how to ask the right questions and present the right information to expand on prior knowledge and curiosities, all while steering the class to practice and master developmentally appropriate skills. It is hard work, and I am excited to have a team with me ready to dissect our curriculum, strengthen our programs, and truly establish the NCCECE as early childhood educational leaders in our field.

Change this important is an evolution over time. The NCCECE will always be learning, testing, planning, and implementing new concepts. In the education field, one thing is constant; the need to evaluate and incorporate ever-evolving best practices for our children. I am excited to be part of a community that believes in best practices and I look forward the NCCECE's future.
