

Six Months

Message from

Rabbi Seth Haaz

On February 1, I celebrated my first six months here at Har Zion, and I now eagerly jump into



these next six months. But, before I do, I want to share with you some of things that give me energy and confidence in the future of our community.

If you are not intimately involved with our synagogue on a frequent basis, you might not have felt the spirit of freshness, innovation, and flexibility that permeates our hallways.

Members of the Board of Directors have begun a conversation about how to improve our governance structure to better suit the needs of our synagogue. Cantor Vogel continues to experiment with different forms of musical accompaniment on Friday nights, and other alternative, creative prayer opportunities for Friday night and Saturday morning are in the works.

New classes and dynamic discussions spearheaded by Rabbi Shawn and Norman Einhorn have cultivated a growing community of adult learners and teen learners, and our staff has been reimagining the Bar and Bat Mitzvah program and the arc of Jewish education for our children and families.

Preschool and religious school parents have initiated a conversation about family services for the High Holy Days, volunteers eagerly participate in our Ritual Committee which has been infused with new energy, and a diverse group of congregants will soon be coming together to offer feedback and suggestions to enhance the Shabbat morning experience at Har Zion.

PASSOVER...

Kashrut for Pesah

Following is a summary of the decisions of the Committee on Jewish Law and Standards (CJLS) of the Rabbinical Assembly pertaining to Passover foods, dishes, and utensils. *Kosher le-Pesah* labels that do not bear the name of a rabbi or one of the recognized symbols of rabbinic supervision, or which are not integral to the package, should not be used without consulting your rabbi.

Prohibited foods include the following: leavened bread, cakes, biscuits, crackers, cereal, coffees containing cereal derivatives, wheat, barley, oats spelt, rye, and all liquids containing ingredients or flavors made from grain alcohol.

Most Ashkenazic authorities have added the following foods (kitniyot) to the above list: rice, corn, millet, legumes (beans and peas; however, string beans are permitted). The CJLS has ruled

מכירת חמץ Sell Your *Hametz*

An integral part of the pre-Passover planning involves the selling of one's hametz. According to Jewish law, we are supposed to rid ourselves from all hametz and utensils which have been used over the course of the year during Passover. The procedure is simple. We follow the custom of selling our hametz and utensils to a non-Jew. In this manner, the Biblical injunction regarding hametz is respected.

In order to facilitate the proceedings, kindly complete the form below and return it to Laurie Albert in the synagogue office.

Let me take this opportunity, while well in advance, to wish you and yours an enjoyable and happy Passover.

unanimously that peanuts and peanut oil are permissible. Some Ashkenazic authorities permit, while others forbid, the use of legumes in a form other than their natural state, for example: corn sweeteners, corn oil, soy oil. Sephardic authorities permit the use of all of the above. Consult a member of the clergy for guidance in the use of these products.

PERMITTED FOODS: A. The following foods require a *kosher le-Pesah* label if purchased before or during Pesah: all baked products (matzah, cakes, matzah flour, farfel, matzah meal, and any products containing matzah); canned or bottled fruit juices (These juices are often clarified with *kitniyot* which are **not** listed among the ingredients. However, if one knows there are no such agents, the juice may be purchased prior to Pesah without a *kosher le-Pesah* label); wine; vinegar; liquor; oils; dried fruits; candy; chocolate flavored milk; ice cream; yogurt, and soda.

B. The following processed foods (canned, bottled or frozen) require a *kosher le-Pesah* label if purchased during Pesah: milk, butter, juices, milk products, spices, coffee, tea, and fish, as well as all foods listed in Category C.

C. The following foods require no *kosher le-Pesah* label if **purchased prior to Pesah**: unopened packages or containers of natural coffee without cereal additives (however, be aware that coffees produced by General Foods are not kosher for Passover unless marked KP); sugar, pure tea (not herbal tea); salt; pepper, natural spices; frozen fruit juices with no additives; frozen (uncooked) vegetables (for legumes see above); milk; butter; cottage cheese; frozen (uncooked) fruit (with no additives).

D. The following foods require no *kosher le-Pesah* label if purchased before or during Pesah: fresh fruits and vegetables (for legumes see above), eggs, fresh fish, and fresh meat.

DETERGENTS: If permitted during the year, powdered and liquid detergents do not require a *kosher le-Pesah* label.

MEDICINE: Since *hametz* binders are used in many pills, the following guidelines should be followed: if the medicine is required for life sustaining therapy, it may be used on Pesah. If it is not for life sustaining therapy, some authorities permit, while others prohibit. Consult the clergy. In all cases, capsules are preferable to pills.

KASHERING OF UTENSILS: The process of kashering utensils depends on how the utensils are used. According to *halakhah*, leaven can be purged from a utensil by the same process in which it was absorbed in the utensil. Therefore, utensils used in cooking are kashered by boiling, those used in broiling are kashered by fire and heat, and those used only for cold food are kashered by rinsing.

A. *EARTHENWARE* (china, pottery, etc.) may not be kashered. However, fine translucent chinaware which has not been used for over a year may be used if scoured and cleaned in hot water.

B. METAL (wholly made of metal) UTENSILS USED IN FIRE (spit, broiler) must first be thoroughly scrubbed and cleansed and then made as hot as possible. Those used for cooking or eating (silverware, pots) must be thoroughly scrubbed and cleaned and completely immersed in boiling water. Pots should not be

used for a period of at least 24 hours between the cleaning and the immersion in boiling water. Metal baking utensils cannot be kashered.

C. OVENS AND RANGES: Every part that comes in contact with food must be thoroughly scrubbed and cleaned. Then, oven and range should be heated as hot as possible for a half hour. If there is a broil setting, use it. Self-cleaning ovens should be put through the self-cleaning cycle according to the manufacturer's instructions. Continuous cleaning ovens must be kashered in the same manner as regular ovens.

Microwave ovens, which do not cook the food by means of heat, should be cleaned, and then two cups of water should be placed inside. Then turn the oven on until one cup of water has boiled away. A microwave oven that has a browning element cannot by kashered for Pesah.

D. *GLASSWARE*: Authorities disagree as to the method for kashering drinking utensils. One opinion requires soaking in water for three days, changing the water every 24 hours. The other opinion requires only a thorough scrubbing before Pesah, or putting them through a dishwasher.

Glass cookware: There is a difference of opinion as to whether this item must be kashered. One opinion is that it must be kashered. After a thorough cleansing, there should be water boiled in it, which will overflow the rim. The other opinion is that only a thorough cleansing is required. Glass bakeware, like metal bakeware, may not be kashered.

E. *DISHWASHER*: After not using the machine for a period of 24 hours, a full cycle with detergent should be run.

F. ELECTRICAL APPLIANCES: If the parts that come into contact with hametz are removable, they can be kashered in the appropriate way (if metal, follow the rules for metal utensils). If the parts are not removable, the appliance cannot be kashered. (All exposed parts should be thoroughly cleaned.)

G. *TABLES, CLOSETS, AND COUNTERS*: If used with hametz, they should be thoroughly cleaned and covered, and then they may be used.

H. KITCHEN SINK: A metal sink can be kashered by thoroughly cleaning and then pouring boiling water over it. A porcelain sink should be cleaned and a sink rack used. If, however, dishes are to be soaked in a porcelain sink, a dish basin must be used.

I. HAMETZ AND NON-PASSOVER UTENSILS: Non-Passover dishes, pots, and hametz whose ownership has been transferred, should be separated, locked up or covered, and marked in order to prevent accidental use.





Where Are We Going This Month?

Message from **Debbie Folz,**Director of Early Childhood Education

A field trip is a great way to make learning come to life by taking children out of their normal environment and allowing them to have hands-on experiences at different



locations. Even children as young as pre-school can benefit from educational trips where they can see things up close and learn more about the world around them. Done right, field trips can be a powerful component of a well-rounded instructional program and that is exactly what our Prachim (Pre-K) and Gan children experience every year. The most popular destinations – museums, zoos, outdoor venues, and performances – have a natural fit with science, history, and the arts.

Our teachers create memories by reinforcing their curriculum. These trips provide students with important cognitive and affective benefits. After learning about Fall, Sukkot and Thanksgiving the children went to the Colonial Plantation where they saw what life was like in Colonial Times including working the farm, what things from the farm were used for and what their homes were like. The year's curriculum will determine where they

will go on field trips. The Prachim and Gan teachers are always planning new and exciting outings for their children. After reading many different versions of folk and fairy tales, they will bring in special programs such as a showing of The Brothers Grimm Version of "The Brave Little Tailor" from the Enchantment Theater Company. Their unique style of performance will bring the story to life in a way that will inspire the children



to use their imagination and stimulate them. The children will bring back to their classrooms different ways to explore the story. Another one of their favorites is the Garden State Discovery Museum, an exciting and fun-filled interactive museum. During the year they will go also to the Art Museum after a month long study of different artists from Chagal to Jackson Pollack. In honor of Earth day and after learning about the environment and ways to help it, the Gan class will go to Riverbend and the Prachim to Waterworks, fostering the appreciation and understanding needed to protect our natural world and teaching us all about how to preserve water. The Academy of Natural Sciences was a big hit when Gan learned about Dinosaurs and this year they might go to the Insectarium where they will see up close and



personal the insects they will learn about in class. All of these trips appeal to varied learning styles, helping children to succeed whether they are visual, auditory or kinetic learners.

Who wouldn't want to be a child in our Prachim and Gan programs, where the lessons they learn in school come to life thanks to the hard work and planning of their incredible teachers?
