God and "Goldberg"

Message from

Rabbi Scott Rosenberg

There is an old joke about synagogue services. The Rabbi asks Mr. Levine why he goes to shul. Mr. Levine responds, "You shouldn't ask me, you should ask



Goldberg. He goes to shul to talk to God. I go to talk to Goldberg."

When I think about what it means to belong to a synagogue today, creating space for people to both talk to God and talk to "Goldberg" are each essential elements of what a synagogue experience should be about. Over the past few months, we have been spending a lot of time talking about our new and expanded program of Shabbat worship and study. We are proud of these new programs. We are proud of how we have listened to the voices of our members as presented in our strategic plan and are growing our spiritual community.

However our strategic map did not only focus on the Shabbat and worship experience. "Talking to Goldberg" or community building is also a major focus of our plan. When I think about our community building efforts, I think about programs like the Joy of Shabbat Dinner, Guess Who is Coming to Shabbat?, our Friday night Onegs, Kiddush after services, study on Shabbat morning, breakfast every day after our morning minyan, or our recently introduced Seudah Shelishit (the third meal) between Minha and Ma'ariv on Shabbat afternoon. All of these are ongoing community-building aspects of the Har Zion experience. They are times you can come, talk, visit with friends, meet new people and get to know the rich and diverse community that considers Har Zion Temple their shul. If you have yet to join us for one of these informal social events, I invite you to join us any time your schedule permits. And (continued on page 3)

Whitwell Comes to Penn Valley Saturday, March 5, 9:30 AM

We welcome our "Paper Clips" friends from Tennessee to our *Kol Tefilah* Service in the Main Sanctuary.

Sandra Roberts, founding teacher of the project, and students Dalton Slatton and Shania Davis will speak on "Sacred Relationships."

The congregation is invited to a special Extended Kiddush celebrating our five-year partnership with the Paper Clips Project. This special Kiddush and celebration is being sponsored by Joy Landau in honor of her birthday.

The Paper Clips Project started as a simple eighth grade project involving students from the small town of Whitwell, Tennessee. The goal was to use Holocaust education to study diversity, tolerance, and prejudices. The project gained worldwide attention and momentum and led to the award-winning documentary film, "Paper Clips." Today, the Whitwell Middle School is the home of the Children's Holocaust Memorial and Museum. At last count, over 33 million paper clips have been received, six million of them housed in an authentic German railcar on the school grounds.

Just a little over a month ago, I attended the annual Jewish Educators Assembly Conference right over the bridge in Mount Laurel, New Jersey. The mission of the Jewish Educators Assembly is to promote excellence among educators committed to Conservative Jewish Education by advancing professionalism, encouraging leadership,



pursuing life-long learning and building community. Every year, Conservative educators of synagogue schools and day schools gather together for a week of learning, networking, and sharing of ideas. The conference begins with a wonderful gala event called "20/20-The Future Is Clear," at which 20 emerging leaders in their 20's from the local Jewish community are honored. Honorees are teachers, youth professionals, and camp professionals, all affiliated with the Conservative Movement.



I am extremely proud to say that one of our very own teachers of The Jane Fishman Grinberg Religious School, specifically our Madregot – Special Needs program, was one of the 20 emerging leaders honored this year. Bryan Kirschner,

the son of Hope and Lee Kirschner, was honored for his commitment to his work with Special Education within the Jewish community.

Bryan has been a member of Har Zion Temple his entire life. He celebrated his Bar Mitzvah at Har Zion, was confirmed from Har Zion and graduated from the JFGRS Midrasha Program where he received a teaching certificate. During high school, Bryan participated in the TAP (Teen Assistant Program) Program through ACAJE/Jewish Learning Venture. TAP is Jewish Learning Venture's education initiative through which a group of selected high school students are trained and mentored to assist children with special needs and those experiencing difficulty in congregational classroom settings and in the community. When Bryan completed the TAP program he served as a teaching assistant in the Madregot program during his senior year. At Penn State University, he was the first freshman at the synagogue to ever be hired to teach Hebrew School primarily due to his experience here at Har Zion. Since he has returned home after graduation in 2011, Bryan has been part of our Madregot faculty. In addition, Bryan has helped run the largest wheelchair basketball league on the East Coast during the summer months. During the winter, he coaches and referees a Special Needs basketball team/ league in West Philadelphia. Bryan is currently studying for (continued on page 13)

Gardening with Children

Message from **Debbie Folz**,

Early Childhood Education Director

Gardening is a wonderful way for children to discover, explore and learn. And what child doesn't enjoy mucking around in the dirt? The beauty of gardening in a preschool program is that you



can involve children every step of the way – from learning about different kinds of plants and deciding what to grow to plant, harvest, and prepare and ultimately share food.

The whole process of gardening, easily woven into the fabric of a preschool day, is an extended sensory and learning experience which could include researching the right plants to grow, preparing the soil, digging and planting, watering, weeding and observing the plants growing and flowering.

This year, The Noreen Cook Center for Early Childhood Education was fortunate that our Home and School Association also saw the benefits of having a garden for our preschoolers. They funded our garden, giving each of our Shorashim, Prachim and Gan classes their own raised bed to cultivate. The children and teachers are now in the process of deciding what to grow, and soon will be planting the seeds. As spring approaches they will partake in nurturing the garden by watering, weeding and watching their seedlings come to life. During the summer, our Har Zion Day Campers will continue to care for the garden. What pleasure and excitement the children will experience when they are able to finally harvest and eat the fruits of their labor! I can't wait to share in the joy of tasting what our children put their hearts and souls into creating.

What Is It About DST?

On March 13, at 2:00 AM, Daylight Saving Time begins. I find the phrase "Daylight Saving Time" intriguing. Philosophizing on its meaning, I wonder about what is being saved and why. Does the phrase mean that daylight is saving time? Or does it mean that we should be saving only when it is daylight? Should we be saving time? Are we saving daylight for future use? "Saved" daylight does not make the night go away. "Saved" time does not extend one's life. Daylight and time are ephemeral assets that we can neither save nor bequeath.

Regardless of Daylight Saving Time, we all have real assets that we want to protect and bequeath to our heirs. But do we know the best way to accomplish this? What strategies are optimal and what pitfalls can be avoided? To find out, please join Har Zion Active Adults Club (HAZAAC) on Wednesday, March 16, when we will present an Estate Planning and Elder Law Workshop seminar led by Ricki Goodstein, Esq. of Goodstein Law Associates. Getting to Know Your Sisters

This month I was privileged to interview Susan Gross. Her story begins after the Holocaust in Transylvania, Romania. Her parents survived the Shoah, however their extended families had mostly been destroyed. Susan grew up in Romania until the age of 15 when her parents were finally granted visas in 1962 to emigrate to France and then the US with only two trunks of clothing and a small suitcase. The family lived in Forest Hills, New York. Upon arriving, Susan's aunt enrolled her in summer school where she learned English in a social studies class. Susan had always been a good student and was advanced in her studies and fluent in Hungarian, Romanian, French, German and Spanish. While a senior in high school she went to Julliard to study piano. She met Peter, also a child of Holocaust survivors, at a bus stop waiting with other teens from Romania. They were married five years later and her life took a big turn! Susan stated, "The story of my life is that I followed my husband everywhere!"

Susan went to Queen's College where she double majored in French and Spanish while Peter was studying astrophysics at Columbia. She worked briefly as a foreign correspondent in New York City before moving to New Haven for Peter's Ph.D. program at Yale. There she worked as a Subject and Language Specialist in the Yale Library cataloguing foreign books. She then decided to get her master's in French and taught for a year until she had their first child, Nicole. Afterwards, the family moved to West Chester for Peter's post-doctorate work at IBM. Their son, Edward, was born here. When Peter took a positon as an assistant professor at Case Western, Susan got her Language Supervisor Certificate and taught. Peter's next career choice brought them to Columbus for an accelerated medical school program. Elissa was born during this time. Finally, Susan requested that for Peter's residency, they move back to the East coast to set down roots and to be closer to their mothers.

The family joined Har Zion in 1982 when Nicole and Edward started religious school. They felt very welcomed by Rabbi Wolpe and the entire congregation. Their 4th child, Amy, was born in 1984, after losing Susan's mother to cancer. Susan has always been active at Har Zion. Besides being involved in the PTA, Sisterhood, and school board, she has served on the Board of Directors for 20 years and was Vice President of Education, Secretary of the Board of Trustees, and served on numerous committees. Susan truly feels that Har Zion is the extended family that she and Peter do not have.

Susan taught French for 30 years and a few years of Spanish in the Lower Merion School System and was the World Language Department Chair at Harriton High School. She also started a Tolerance and Acceptance unit while at Harriton to help students study people of different cultures and backgrounds. She feels strongly that respect and acceptance of all people is paramount for a healthy society. Susan also (continued on page 13)




