We also don't have to be inside to gather at Har Zion – exciting outdoor changes are coming! Construction of the pavilion beyond the south parking lot will begin in the next months. Ritual Matters

Message from **Dr. Ely Levine**,
Ritual Director and Scholar in Residence

Whether this issue of the *Bulletin* reaches your mailbox at the beginning of May or at the end of May, it will be a time to remember. The last Monday in May, of course, is Memorial Day, designated in the aftermath of the Civil War as a day to recall those who died in the war. Yom HaZikaron, Israeli Memorial Day, is observed on 4 Iyar, corresponding this year to Tuesday night to Wednesday, May 3-4. This was a day established by the Knesset to commemorate soldiers who fell in wars and civilians who were killed in acts of terror. Maybe there is something about May, because Armed Services Day, commemorating active service members, is the third Saturday in May, and Yom Ha'Atzmaut (Israeli Independence Day, 5 Iyar) falls on May 4-5 and Yom Yerushalayim (28 Iyar) falls on Saturday night to Sunday, May 28-29.



That is a lot of remembering! It is not surprising that there is no date on which we are instructed to forget! We all know that we do plenty of that: it is our default setting. The dates asking us to remember are the punctuation in the otherwise steady stream of forgetfulness.

Another day in May is Mother's Day. Please do not mistake me: I value mothers very much; I just think that we ought to show them that every day, not just on the second Sunday in May. Same with fathers, grandparents, and administrative professionals. What does it say that we need a single day on the calendar for each of these groups? Clearly, that we neglect them for 364 days of the year.

So what about Yahrzeits? On yahrzeits, the anniversary of a death, we commemorate the life of a loved one. Our tradition adds four days each year on top of the yahrzeit when we recite Yizkor, including on the second day of Shavuot (June 6, this year). We are given some time to remember in private: we light a candle to symbolize the light that the person continues to bring into our lives. But we also need to remember in public – not because of some psychological need to perform our continuing grief, but because being with our community is an antidote to that grief. Coming into the community allows us to live the life inspired by our loved ones. It also gives us the opportunity to share those memories that inspire us with others, thus keeping the memories alive.

Yes, this is a plug for coming to our daily services to help make a minyan. It is also an invitation to share memories and to build memories inspired by our loved ones: both to remember – and to become – what they mean for us in our lives.

It has been a joy for me to meet many of you through our multifaith programming, learn about your lives and interfaith families, and serve as a resource since beginning at Har Zion in 2019. So as I leave this role, I ask you all to please continue to find the courage to have the hard conversations. Ask questions when you encounter difference, instead of giving in to fear. Be willing to share your Judaism with those of other religions and also with other Jews, for we have so much beautiful diversity within our own community. Remember that we are all created *betzelem Elohim*, in the image of G-d, and that is true even and especially in those with whom we disagree – we just have to be willing to seek it out.

May we all see the day when we can live in true diverse harmony and peace, and let us all build that better world together.

The winter and early spring has been a time of seeing a light at the end of the long, dark pandemic tunnel. We have been so pleased to bring parents back into the Religious School, to learn with their children and experience first-hand some of the accomplishments we have made. A special feature of this year is our effort, funded by the Abiri-Jean Family Fund for Religious School Special Programs, to help each child build their own Jewish library. Our Gan and Aleph class had a Model Shabbat dinner, where they demonstrated the Shabbat table *brachot* that they have learned. Each family received a book *Shabbat at Home*, a guide to family-based Shabbat ritual and experience. Our Bet class had a short service when they demonstrated some of the prayers they have learned, and each received *Siddur Sholom*, the prayerbook we use each day of Religious School. This also marks their learning to decode the Aleph-Bet and actually read the prayers themselves! Gimel learned *Birkat HaMazon*, and had a special dinner with parents where they sang the blessing after dinner, and received a *Birkon*, a small book of blessings and songs. Dalet received a Haggadah *A Night to Remember* at the Keiser-Wilf Religious School Passover Seder. Hay will mark the beginning of their Bar and Bat Mitzvah preparation as they receive an *Etz Chayim Humash*, and Vav will receive a standard *Siddur Sim Shalom* as part of our Shavuot celebration in June. By the end of their elementary and middle school experience in the Jane Fishman Grinberg Religious School, our children will have the beginnings of a wonderful Jewish library!

Sunday, April 3 marked our annual Keiser-Wilf Religious School Seder. Our children prepared for weeks – learning special Seder melodies for songs and blessings, learning about the various aspects of the Pesach story, and making special projects to beautify our Model Seder as well as your Sedarim at home. This is another example of a time when our parents come together with the children to experience the richness of Jewish tradition and the bonds formed with our greater Har Zion family.

As we wind down our school year in May, we have many special activities planned. On Sunday, May 1 our Hay class and

parents celebrated as they begin their Bar/Bat Mitzvah studies with a Parasha Pizza party. 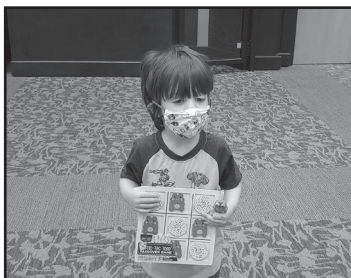

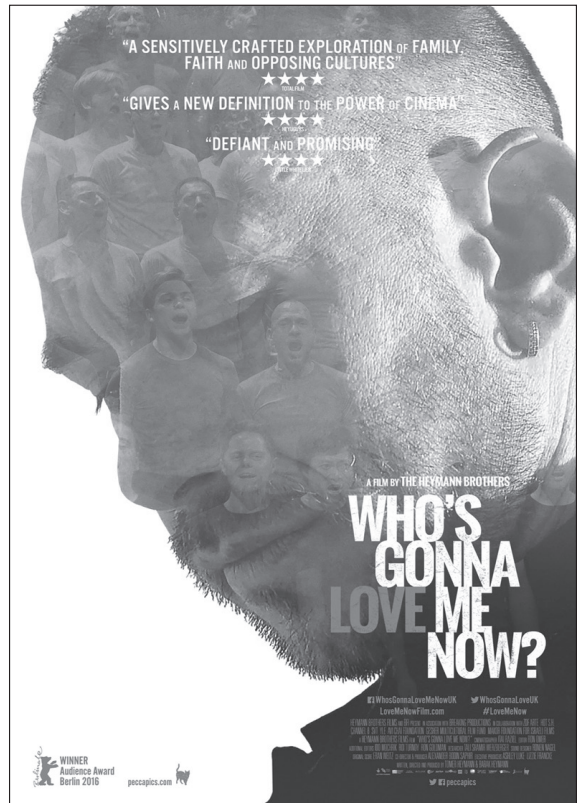
