Ritual Matters

Message from **Dr. Ely Levine**, Ritual Director and Scholar in Residence

As this issue of the *Bulletin* hits your mailboxes, we are counting the Omer, the seven-week period between Pesah and Shavuot. Once upon a time, this was a way of marking time between the beginning of the barley harvest (at Pesah) and the beginning



of the wheat harvest (at Shavuot). For our ancestors, barley was a heartier and more reliable crop than wheat, but wheat was more desired as food. While waiting for the more desirable crop, our ancestors made offerings of sheaves of barley. They were taking a chance that the yield of the wheat harvest might not be enough to make it through the year.

But during the Rabbinic period, because the agricultural cycles were not as much a part of everyone's lives, the Omer period transformed. According to the stories, a plague afflicted Rabbi Akiba's students and thousands of them died, so the Omer is now a period of semi-mourning.

I sometimes wonder about these Rabbinic stories: which came first, the story or the practice that the story justifies? But it is interesting to note that this period of self-denial between Pesah and Shavuot is mirrored by a Christian period of self-denial for the 40 days *before* Easter. Lent is observed by many Christians by abstaining from eating meat, from sacrificing some enjoyed activities. In an episode of M*A*S*H, Klinger even gives up atheism for Lent! This year, Ramadan falls half in Lent and half in the Omer. The Muslim month of daily fasting and nightly feasting is an interesting foil for the other two observances.

But why is it so important to deny ourselves? Our society focuses a lot on treating ourselves, advertisements encourage us to splurge and spoil ourselves and our pets, but our traditions ask us to lean the other way – at least for a time. Is this something edifying? Does it make us stronger? Or is that just what people tell us to make us suffer unnecessarily?

In the same way that an eight-day sojourn in a rickety shack (a sukkah) can help us to appreciate the fact that for the rest of the year we live in safe, dry homes, periods of self-denial can help us to appreciate what we have. When we appreciate that we have sufficient food, shelter, and love, we should take notice of those who do not.

Our *mitzvot* help cultivate in us a sense of awareness of and empathy for others. We are aware that denying ourselves during this period – whether we go without haircuts, celebrations, or listening to music – is a choice we make, and it is temporary. We also know that this choice never puts us in any real danger. This gives us perspective on those for whom it is not a choice, for whom there is no end in sight, and who lack actual bare necessities.

Sure, there is value in self-denial, but only because it is self-imposed and temporary. Without darkness, how would we appreciate light? Without sadness, how would we appreciate being happy? We get a taste of what it is like to live without, and we know that we would not want to have to do this for any longer. How wonderful it would be if everyone's experiences of limitation, of lack, of suffering, were self-imposed and temporary.

EDUCATION ...

Message from Dr. Michael Schatz, Assistant Director, JFGRS

With Pesach behind us, we focus on celebrating Israel at 75 this spring! There are three modern holidays, all declared by the State of Israel since its founding 75 years ago.



Nisan 27, this year falling on Tuesday, April 18, is *Yom HaShoah ve-ha-Gevurah*, the Day of Remembrance for the Holocaust and Heroism. It is observed at this particular time in association with the Warsaw Ghetto uprising in the spring of 1943. Unlike the International Holocaust Remembrance Day, observed on the commemoration of the liberation of Auchwitz in January, *Yom HaShoah* acknowledges one of the days the Jews fought back. We remember the six million martyrs, but we also remember the heroes, the survivors and the righteous gentiles who helped assure Never Again. We welcomed Fred Gross, co-sponsored with the Men's Club, for a program dedicated to the memory of his parents, Holocaust survivors.

Yom HaZikaron, Memorial Day for Israel's fallen soldiers, is observed on 4 Iyar, and the following day is Yom HaAtzmaut, celebrating Israel's independence in 1948 as the first self-governed Jewish country in our historic homeland after 2000 years. These fall on April 25 and 26 this year, and we will celebrate with a great big Israel Festival on Sunday May 7 at religious school. First, we have Building Blocks Workshops coming, to construct a model of the Old City of Jerusalem out of Lego with our children and parents. This is a wonderful, fun and educational program that includes a "tour" of the holy city. Later we will celebrate with Israeli food and dance with Rak-Dan in the Sayer-Berkowitz Pavilion outside. Israel is celebrated at Har Zion and this year's activity will be very special.

The closing weeks of religious school also include our Bet and Vav class Kabbalat Siddurim program, where the Bet children receive their first Siddur, and the Vav children receive their own engraved copy of Siddur Sim Shalom. The Hay class will have an end of year Better Together celebration with their empty-nester friends, as well as parents, and will receive their own engraved Etz Hayim Chumash.

We will finish our school year with our Move-Up Day, including celebrating our B'nai Mitzvah Class, our Confirmands, all of our JFGRS children, and our teacher honored with the Isadore L. Kirschner Teacher Award on June 4.

The teachers and leadership of the Jane Fishman Grinberg Religious School wish all of our families a safe and relaxing summer. See you in September!



Sisterhood Update

Message from Michele Perlstein, Sisterhood President

On February 25, Sisterhood held it's Sisterhood Shabbat service (our first together in person in three years) during which I had to give a sermon for the first time in my life. Preparing the sermon gave me the chance to review everything Sisterhood does. This really cemented for me just how much we do for our community.

Here is a reminder of all the wonderful ways Har Zion Sisterhood supports and strengthens our community:

We have a plethora of **EDUCATION and PROGRAMMING** opportunities. Some of these are regularly occurring and have been ongoing for many years, such as <u>Open A Book...Open Your Mind</u> – this year is our 10th anniversary! We also have <u>Book Club</u> with monthly discussions of selected books, and <u>Rosh Hodesh</u> with warm, interactive, and challenging discussions related to the holidays and themes of each month. This year, we've had <u>ongoing Torah study sessions with Rabbi Haaz</u>, and also held a lovely <u>program outside in the Sukkah during Sukkot</u> in which Cantor Silverberg taught us about some of our Jewish heroines.

Then there's all the general fun programming we offer throughout the year with interesting speakers from HZT and community. This year we were especially happy to offer programming that highlighted DEI and inclusion efforts.

Sisterhood also provides strong, unwavering **SUPPORTTO THE SYNAGOGUE** in a number of ways. Every Sukkot we undertake the decorating of our beautiful Maurice Kendall Sukkah. We also give contributions for youth activities, Madregot, the Rabbi's Discretionary Fund, Shabbat and Holiday Kiddushes, as well as synagogue events such as the Hanukkah Happening. We were proud to be able to contribute to many improvements to the synagogue over the years including the recent upgrade to the playground. I also want to make special mention of **our beautiful Landau Gift Box**. I have had the chance to see quite a few synagogue gift shops over the years, but I have yet to see one as spectacular as ours.

But the support of our Sisterhood does not stop there. We undertake several **LARGER COMMUNITY SERVICE/TIKKUN OLAM EFFORTS** on a regular basis. Every year we have our <u>charitable contributions</u>, such as the Jewish Braille Institute, JNF, Kosher Meals on Wheels, Masorti, Mazon, and Torah Fund.

This year, as part of our opening dinner event we partnered with the Tikkun Olam committee to collect Kosher canned goods which were distributed by ElderNet for delivery to individuals in our area that are experiencing food insecurity. Throughout December, we undertook a collection of women's personal hygiene products which were donated to Jewish Federation of Greater Philadelphia's Mitzvah Food Pantry.

In January, for the <u>MLK Day of Service</u>, many Sisterhood members participate in this synagogue-wide event, chaired by two Sisterhood members. There's also our <u>Shul Stitchers</u> program where Sisterhood members knit blankets that are sent to Israel for soldiers in the IDF.

As part of our connection with Women's League for Conservative Judaism, every year we hold a <u>Torah Fund Event</u> that raises money

Tikkun Olam Visits Area Nursing Homes

For the past 35 years, members of Har Zion Temple have been providing a Jewish presence at Saunders House. In the mid-1990's, Doris Grossmann (of blessed memory) would accompany her mother to Jewish services that were held at Saunders where her mother resided after a stroke. With some change in staff, instead of no services, Doris' mother said: "You do." This was the beginning of a beautiful relationship between HZT and Saunders. For many years, Doris led a weekly Shabbat service and "became a fixture in the institution" as her daughter, Michele Forman stated. Of note, when a resident of the facility passed away, family members would often make contributions to enable the continuation of Shabbat services. The service welcomed anyone to attend. Family members and residents of other faiths would also attend. Over the years, HZT has been supportive in providing clergy and staff to assist with Passover and other services, and has provided funds for grape juice and challah. We have engaged other constituencies in our efforts. For example, the Hebrew school has made greeting cards, New Year's cards, decorated bags for Tu B'Shevat, and photocopied large type Shabbat service booklets with hand colored illustrations.

About 20 years ago, the chaplain serving both Saunders House and Bryn Mawr Village (formerly Bryn Mawr Terrace) asked for a volunteer to lead services at Bryn Mawr Village. Eileen Chopnick stepped forward and led a Seder accompanied by an Eagle Scout from South Ardmore for the "hamishie" model Seder for one resident. The model provided by Doris has been an inspiration for the service at Bryn Mawr Village.

Both nursing homes have been supportive of having a Shabbat service and placing the announcement in the monthly activities. Staff remains preset during services. If you would like to volunteer for the weekly Kabbalat Service at Saunders House, please contact Andy Coren at andreajoy.coren@gmail.com. If you would like to volunteer for the bi-weekly service at Bryn Mawr Village, please contact Eileen Chopnick at emc114@aol.com.

Please remember those in need over the summer months too. Immigrants are still arriving and food insecurity is all around us! There is a new shelter that has opened in Upper Darby called Breakin Bread that accepts 17 people from 7 PM until 7 AM. The Life Center of Eastern Delaware County is assisting in providing additional meals to these people too. Drinks and non-food items such as plates, utensils, napkins, cups, etc. are always in demand. Have a safe and relaxing summer!
