Message from Rabbi Rosenberg

Jewish tradition considers Ruth the Moabite to be the first Jew by Choice. Ruth was King David's great-grandmother, and earned the title



of first Jew by Choice because of the focus of the story in the Biblical book that bears her name. Let's think about this. Were there not other "Jews By Choice" who preceded her? There was Abram and Sarai, Jethro, Moses' father-in-law and Rahab of Jericho, the woman who lived in the walls of this ancient city and protected the scouts who came to see the land just before Joshua and his troops invaded. So if other people chose Judaism as their faith before Ruth, why does tradition give her this title?

Perhaps the answer lies in the language Ruth chose when she accepted her new faith. On Shavuot, which begins this year on Saturday night, May 23, we read the story of this Moabite woman who proclaimed her Jewishness. Ruth said to her mother-in-law Naomi: "Your people shall be my people, and your God my God." (Ruth 1:17)

In these words, Ruth demonstrates a deep understanding of what being Jewish is all about. It was Ruth who first perceived the concept of belonging to the people of Israel before the "God idea." Ruth understood that before she could embrace God's Torah and the *mitzvot*, she must first be committed to embracing the Jewish people as her own. Through the sequence of her wording, Ruth is reminding us that a Jew cannot function Jewishly, in the fullness of what that means, without a community, and that a Jewish community could not function well without a sense of belonging to the people, to *Klal Yisrael* – the whole of Israel.

When we think about Ruth's message today, it is easy to argue that these same set of priorities hold true. Creating community is a Jewish priority. Before we can accept and value the *(continued on page 3)*

Har Zion Temple's Policy Regarding Participation of a Non-Jew in Our Worship Services

Har Zion Temple is committed to bringing each member and each family, regardless of personal background, faith or level of observance, close to the values of Torah that we as a congregation hold sacred. Recognizing the dynamic and evolutionary nature of Torah, our leadership has engaged in a conversation about changing some of our practices in a way that reflects both the dynamic nature of Jewish tradition and the realities of contemporary Jewish life.

One of the areas that we have focused on has been the participation by non-Jewish family members in synagogue life. Our conversation about the overall relationship between our sacred community and non-Jews who desire to show support for our mission, continues to be a source of ongoing and engaged discussion for our leadership. Many of our members have participated in focus groups, communitywide programs and discussions, or have otherwise shared thoughts, ideas, stories and experiences with members of the Keruv Outreach Committee, as well as with officers and members of our board of directors. We hope that these challenging, yet inspiring conversations will continue to guide us in navigating the realities of maintaining a vibrant Conservative Synagogue in our day.

At this point in the conversation among our clergy, Keruv Outreach Committee, Religious Committee and synagogue leadership, the following opportunities will be made available to all adults for a bar/bat mitzvah and at other occasions as applicable:

- Tallit presentation to the bar/bat mitzvah.
- Poem or non-core appropriate reading at the time of the presentation of the tallit.
- Participate in either or both of the Torah processionals.
- Parent's prayer to the bar/bat mitzvah at the conclusion of the Torah service.
- Deliver words of Torah to their child in accordance with the standards and practices established by the Rabbi.
- Open/Close the exterior metal doors to the ark at the start of Shaharit or at the conclusion of the service.
- A non-Jewish partner may accompany a Jew to the Bimah when called for an Aliyah. We recognize that only the Jewish honoree will be called by their Jewish name and recite: Prayer for the Country (p. 148) and Prayer for the State of Israel (p. 149).
- Lead the Prayer for Peace (p. 149). (If included in the day's liturgy.)
- Stand for and participate in the *She-heheyanu*.
- For those under 13, join the Cantor and other children on the bimah for *Ein Keloheinu*.

We hope that these changes will create a warmer, more welcoming and inclusive environment for our members.



EDUCATION . . .

Our Future Message from

Rabbi Nogah Marshall, Educational Director

As a Jewish Educator, what I try to instill in the minds of my students is that there are no endings in Judaism. Jewish education is ongoing and as one becomes a Bar or Bat Mitzvah, a whole world is opened up as he or she is welcomed into the community as a Jewish adult.



One of Har Zion Temple's programs that I am most proud of is our High

School of Jewish Studies and the A.M. Ellis Midrasha led by our co-principals Norman Einhorn and Steven Goldberg. Students in these programs have committed to continue their Jewish studies post B'nai Mitzvah in grades 8-12. On a typical Sunday morning, our building is filled with over 50 high school students studying and socializing together.

On Tuesday, May 19, Har Zion Temple will honor our 10th grade Confirmation Students and our 12th grade graduates of the A.M. Ellis Midrasha program for their commitment to continuing their Jewish education. nazi Jewish origin made from matzo fried with eggs. There are many recipes for this dish. Typically the dry matzah is briefly softened in hot water or milk,

broken into pieces, mixed with eggs, and pan-fried in butter, oil or schmaltz. It may be formed into a cake, like a frittata, or broken up and cooked like scrambled eggs. It can be savory or sweet.



Even though it's already May, we need to share with you what the Har Zion Men's Club did on a special night two months ago, on March 19.

On that evening, we hosted Dr. Joseph Carver and his assistant, Rabbi Robert Alpert, to cook up a variety of matzah



brei recipes of their choice. Dr. Carver made five different recipes in this sequence. First, we all got to taste a batch of plain fried matzah. Next, he cooked his fried matzah and coated it with grated onions, pepper and fresh cilantro. On the third batch he concocted an incredibly delicious frittata

made of onion, mushrooms, sautéed eggplant and ginger,

which was out of this world! The fourth fried matzah had creamed spinach, cut up tomatoes and cheddar cheese (infused) inside. Finally, Dr. Joe made up his own batch of kosher S'mores, with



Nestle Chocolate Quick mix, chocolate chips, cinnamon, and honey – what a delightfully delicious treat!

Matzah brei may also be topped with sauces such as apple sauce, salsa or preserves. Some eat it with sugar, syrup, or jelly. (Note that, in accordance with Jewish dietary laws, if matzah brei is prepared with any dairy product [e.g. butter] it should not be eaten with meat, nor should it contain or be eaten with dairy if cooked in schmaltz.) Looking forward, the Men's Club invites any Har Zion men to join us on Thursday, May 14 when we host Rabbi Jonathan Porath at the home of Steve Moskowitz. During his visit from Israel, Rabbi Porath will share time with us and tell us about the greatest Jewish men of all time, in one hour! Thanks goes out to Rabbi Gary Charlestein for his support of this program.

NEW BOOK

"David's Secret Demons: Messiah, Murderer, Traitor, King" by Baruch Halpern

In a dazzling display of erudition, Halpern dissects the story of David with sparkling, witty prose, using historical, textual, psychological and archaeological analysis. Conventional perceptions of David fault him for his affair with Bathsheba and for arranging the death of her husband, but generally portray him as a handsome, brave shepherd who became king and established Jerusalem as Israel's capital. Halpern elaborates and exploits the story of Bathsheba to paint David as a villain. He methodically demolishes any positive image of David, calling him a serial killer, thug, mercenary, adulterer, assassin, bandit, brigand and predator. Many sources are given to support these allegations. While Halpern's picture of David is largely negative, he presents him as a complex biblical character who was "the first human being in world literature" but "not someone whom it would be wise to invite to dinner." Although Halpern forfeits accessibility by using such a number of esoteric terms, this is an outstanding study. (Publisher's Weekly)




