

#### The Bedtime Shema Message from Cantor Herman

There is a simple, soothing, sacred Jewish ritual that I perform on a nightly basis – the Bedtime Shema. At some point after my head hits the pillow each night – sometimes immediately, sometimes after a little



while – I recite the Shema. I may whisper it, or chant it very softly, or just think it. Often I will start to "breathe" it, slow my breath down, and imagine each syllable reverberating within me, with a mystical vibration echoing from ancient times....

I don't remember ever planning to do this, but just started doing it somewhere along the way. There is something about the closing out of the day, and transitioning into the mysterious, lovely experience of sleep.... Sleep is actually a profoundly vulnerable state; perhaps I find comfort in aligning myself with a force (real or imagined) that binds me to a people and a history - as I drift off into sweet, trusting defenselessness. Sleep forces you to temporarily let go of pursuits and concerns, to take time for your deeper self and wellbeing; the only way to get a satisfying, restful night's sleep is to accept your life, as it is, in that moment. The mystics believe that saying the Shema with intense mental focus can cleanse the soul....

The Shema is the oldest fixed daily prayer in Judaism. The Hebrew words have a beautiful sound, and have literally been recited every single day, somewhere on earth, throughout history since ancient times. The Shema implores us to listen, to really *hear*. And though we are a people scattered across the globe, extending through countless generations, we are referred to collectively, intimately, by an individual name: *Yisrael*. 
members who made countless calls and sent numerous texts and emails offering congregants an honor. Thank you to the ushers who helped in so many ways.

## Message from Dr. Michael Schatz, Principal, JFGRS

What a wonderful beginning of the 5784 school year we have had already in the Jane Fishman Grinberg Religious School! We were thrilled to welcome over 165 students back with an opening day fun fair. After meeting our teachers and new classmates, everyone enjoyed some Israeli dance, an art project



creating tzedakah boxes, and some outdoor fun under the Sayer-Berkowitz Pavilion featuring basketball, an inflatable obstacle course and a bounce house. The morning ended with ice cream and popsicles for all. Through the Hagim our students enjoyed celebrating and davening with the special holiday prayers, and visited the Kendall Sukkah to bench Lulav and enjoy a Sukkot treat.

In the coming months, we are looking forward to our second cohort of Better Together, the funded intergenerational program that brings together JFGRS middle school students and two groups of empty-nester congregants for learning and camaraderie. Cohort II will get to know their fifth grade partners over a lovely brunch and visit the Weitzman National Museum of American Jewish History. 


