Message from Hazzan Vogel

In her bestselling book "To Begin Again," Rabbi Naomi Levy relates the following story. It was told to her by Sam, the wise and elderly shammos in her first congregation. Back in Europe, Sam's grandmother owned a small hotel and she needed to hire someone with a horse and cart to run errands for her business. When a man came to apply for the



job, she asked him this question: "What would you do if you were riding somewhere and a heavy obstacle was blocking the road?"

The man replied, "I would get out of the cart and move it out of my way." Sam's grandmother asked, "But what if it was too heavy to move?" The man responded, "Then I would try to steer the horse around it." Sam's grandmother said, "what if there was no way around it?" The man said, "Then I would have to turn back." Sam's grandmother said "Thank you," then showed the man out. When she closed the door, she told Sam that the man didn't get the job. Sam was puzzled. The man had seemed nice enough and he really needed the work. But his grandmother said, "He didn't give the right answer." Sam asked "What did he say that was wrong?" His grandmother explained, "We don't live by ourselves in this world. If you're in trouble, you go for help."

As we look to the beginning of a New Year, this story offers an object lesson in how Jews have classically approached obstacles. We think of Abraham in the Binding of Isaac, Hagar in the (Continued on page 6)

wilderness, or the Israelites at the shore of the Red Sea. Whether it is from looking more deeply inward, outward or upward, the answers are there if we shift our energies from despair to hope. Both Abraham and Hagar "lifted their eyes" to see something they hadn't noticed before. For Abraham, it was the ram stuck in the thicket, to be offered in place of Isaac. For Hagar, it was the well of water which saved the life of her son Ishmael. The Israelites at the Red Sea were stuck until they allowed their faith and trust in God to overpower their fears. When the answers are not readily apparent, our opponents are intractable or when the barriers to our goals seem insurmountable – the Jewish approach has always been to "make a way out of no way."

In the story, Sam's grandmother reminds us not to try to "go it alone." There is no harm or shame in asking others for help. None of us travel alone on this planet. We are bound together. We need and rely upon each other. In truth, there are no "selfmade" men or women – everyone has at some point or another needed a hand up.

The New Year is a time to reflect on what it means to be part of a "faith community." While there are few descriptions that fit the entire "membership of Har Zion Temple," I believe that we all seek to live lives marked by a generosity of spirit. We look to be understanding of the needs of others and to give of ourselves when called upon. Perhaps this year we should apply that same generosity of spirit to ourselves – by enriching ourselves through the gifts of our faith and by what others are willing to share with us



We bless You, O Lord, who has created joy and gladness,

bridegroom and bride, mirth and exaltation...

So starts the seven benedictions of the wedding ceremony. This inscription lies on our Chuppah (wedding canopy) under which hundreds of couples have stood united during their wedding ceremonies over the past decades. Back in April 1977, the Sisterhood presented Har Zion with this magnificent Chuppah in honor of the synagogue's move to Penn Valley. Now, over 40 years later, the Chuppah has been lovingly restored by the Har Zion Ritual Object Committee for use by wedding couples for many more years to come. Isa Goldfarb designed the original beautiful panels which were individually hand-stitched in needlepoint by many members of Sisterhood in the 1970's, in conjunction with the beautiful frame made by Albert Wood & Sons, the designers who made all of our pulpit furniture.

Thankfully, the original needlepoint is still intact. Restoration efforts included recovering the backs of the panels, installing new fasteners on the silk top, sewing storage sleeves for the individual panels and wooden poles, and hand-polishing the woodwork. We wish to thank Alan Dranoff, Lydia Gesoff, Isa Goldfarb, Connie Handen, Gavi Miller, Charlotte Muchnick, Sue Ellen Rosenblum, and Judy Shrager for their expertise and time spent in preserving this work of art.


