Throughout this High Holy Day season, we will reflect on this incredibly disrupted period in the life of our local, national, and global community. We have now been living through the COVID-19 pandemic for more than a year and a half, and, at the moment that I write this, we are losing ground; the number of those contracting and suffering from COVID-19 is again on the rise in our country. While the expectation of continued disruption is surely a blow to



our morale, we have acquired some tools that can help us remain hopeful and committed to a better tomorrow. In particular, we have learned to rebalance the activities with which we fill our days, and, in doing so, we have learned to recalibrate our priorities. We have experienced more than one way to perform many of our daily professional, personal, and even spiritual tasks. Whether we choose to encounter the upcoming High Holy Days from the Har Zion sanctuary, from our outdoor campus, or from home, the sacred Days of Awe offer us an opportunity to reflect on how well we are living our lives according to our core values.

When I think about the recalibration of priorities and rebalancing of daily tasks, a teaching of Greg McKeown, author of *Essentialism*, comes to mind.

You've likely seen the example of filling a jar with rocks and sand. If the sand is placed first, followed by the stones, then the large rocks, not everything will fit. But if the large rocks are placed first, followed by the stones, and then the sand, everything will fit neatly.

Through the loss and anxiety caused by the pandemic and from our responses, we have been forced to reconsider how we fill our respective jars. We now recognize our tendency to treat small stones as larger rocks and larger rocks as sand. This awareness provides us with an opportunity to fill our jars a bit more neatly. On these High Holy Days, let us listen, reflect, and pray a great prayer that will sustain and inspire us throughout the coming year. Let us gather and prioritize our rocks, stones, and sand, and let us maximize the meaning and beauty that we receive from life and create for others.

A joyful, healthy, and sweet new year, Har Zion, from my family to yours.

On the Eve of 5782 – A Hazzan's Thoughts

Message from Hazzan Eliot Vogel

Like so many others, I was hoping that we'd be entering this High Holiday season with far fewer feelings of uncertainty about the future. We ache to return to "normal."



In countless ways over the past 18 months, our fortitude and resilience have been tested to the maximum. We have experienced fear, grief, sadness and disappointment to a degree most of us have never known. At times we've fought the urge to surrender to despair. We have sought and found means to cope with the stress. Some have turned to religion and spirituality, while others have increased their social activism. Eventually coming to the realization that endless worry was getting me nowhere, I found myself a new mantra: "Despair is not a strategy."

Standing on the precipice of this New Year, I toggle between feelings of gratitude with a glimmer of hopefulness, and pessimism spiked with persistent anxiety. Perhaps my feelings would be best summed up in this way: "We're not where we were, but we're not yet where we'd like to be." I'm grateful for how far we've come in the past year in combatting COVID-19, but I'm still quite anxious over the Delta variant and the inconceivable level of vaccine hesitancy that exists. I welcome the changes in political direction that have occurred both in the US and in Israel, but I'm confounded and distressed by the degree to which falsehoods prevail, and the lengths to which some people will go to deny the basic human rights of others. Perhaps it's time to realize that hope can co-exist with my other feelings.

At this moment in time, I am also mindful of the fact that I have only two more High Holiday seasons left to serve as your Hazzan. This brings some additional dimensions to my ruminations. I have so much for which to be grateful, but I wouldn't be honest if I didn't admit to some regrets over opportunities missed. Living with uncertainty has been a preoccupation for me this past year and a half, but it has reinforced some of life's most important lessons.

The Israeli poet Yehuda Amichai wrote, "A man doesn't have time in his life to have time for everything. He doesn't have seasons enough to have a season for every purpose. Ecclesiastes was wrong about that. A man needs to love and to hate at the same moment, to laugh and cry with the same eyes, with the same hands to throw stones and to gather them, to make love in war and war in love."

None of us knows what tomorrow may bring. The pandemic may peter out or be with us indefinitely. My blessing for all of us for this New Year is that we acquire the gift of learning how to live "without knowing"; to be able to face contradictions with equanimity, and to be able to embrace the paradoxes that surround us on a daily basis. I wish all you a *Shanah Tovah U'metukah* — a Sweet, Happy and Healthy New Year!

Message from Dr. Ely Levine

"What a long strange trip it's been!"

– Grateful Dead

When I was growing up, this was the favorite line of yearbook signers. People for whom four years of high school is a significant portion of their life reflect back on the experience with this sentiment. It is a



way of suggesting that life after this graduation will begin to pass more quickly and that it will somehow become more "normal." Perhaps more generously, it is a teenage way of saying that things will never be the same.

When we were young, however, we did not realize that strange and normal are not so different from one another. While we may reflect on how strange a previous period of life may have felt, it probably seemed pretty normal at the time. Other times, experiences that feel strange in the moment are smoothed out by hindsight. What is truly strange about our lives is how the strangeness is, in fact, the norm. Another way of saying that is why should it be normal now; it was never normal before!

In this last year, we have become accustomed to what, just a few years ago, had been unimaginable. Certainly none of this is what any of our ancient rabbis had imagined when they were planning out Judaism centuries ago! Notice, however, how quickly the unimaginable and unimagined became normal. But those rabbis were also as revolutionary as they were conservative. After all, the Judaism that they built was nothing like the Biblical religious practice that came before them. The rabbis' success can be seen in the degree to which we forget they ever did anything! Following their lead, we talk about the Biblical origins of all our rituals, even – and perhaps especially – the rituals that have no basis in the Torah!

As we gain enough perspective to look back on the COVID period, I hope that we will find a way to emulate our rabbis. We have introduced some revolutionary changes into our lives and into our ritual lives. One day, we may look back on this and barely notice the change. Or, perhaps, we will have so smoothly returned to "normal" that we barely remember the blip.

More likely, however, we will continue to experience a lot more tumult in our lives – excitement and challenge, difficulty and opportunity. Every time, it will feel like the world is changing, that we have reached an inflection point. But each will remind us that every day is a long, strange trip, and every day is just as normal as every other!
